Senate Discretionary Admissions					
Mature Age Category 1: Mature Age Admission for applicants with SC with Endorsement, or NSC/NC(V)/SC(a) with Degree Admission	Candidates 23 years and older at point of registration, with an endorsed Senior Certificate or a National Senior Certificate with Bachelor's Degree pass or National Certificate (Vocational) with Bachelor's degree Pass or Senior Certificate (amended) with Bachelor's Degree pass can be accepted on a senate discretionary mature age admission if they do not meet the additional admission requirements. Their academic progress will be tracked and reported at Senate. A USAf Exemption Certificate is not required.				
Mature Age Category 2: Mature Age Exemption - SC not endorsed	Candidates having attained the age of 23 before or during the first year of registration with a Senior Certificate, with a minimum of 40% in at least four higher or standard grade subjects at least three of which shall have been passed simultaneously and one of which shall be a recognised higher grade subject. A USAf Exemption Certificate is required.				
Mature Age Category 3: Mature Age Exemption - NSC/NC(V)/SC(a) with Diploma Admission	Candidates having attained the age of 23 before or during the first year of registration with a Senior Certificate (Amended), National Senior Certificate or National Senior Certificate (Vocational) with a minimum of 40% in at least four higher or standard grade or 20-credit subjects (or equivalent), at least three of which shall have been passed simultaneously and in the case of a Senior Certificate (Amended), at least one of which shall be a recognised higher grade subject. A Diploma Pass on these certificates would imply that the candidate qualifies.				



	Senate Discretionary Admission - Mature Age NSC/NC(V)/SC(a) Hold must be selected so that the USAf Exemption Certificate may be applied for by the Office of the Registrar.
Mature Age Category 4: Mature Age Exemption - 45 years and older	Candidates must have attained the age of 45 before or during the first year of registration. A USAf Exemption Certificate is required.
Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)	<p>Where candidates do not satisfy the formal admission requirements for this qualification, The IIE may consider an admission application in terms of the Qualification Completion, Credit Accumulation and Transfer, Articulation and Recognition of Prior Learning Policy (IIE010).</p> <p>If applicant does not meet minimum admission requirements and there is no alternative (such as completion of NQP modules) but they have relevant experience, the following must be requested to consider admission via RPL:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Certificates for all formal (Accredited Higher Education qualifications) and/or informal qualifications/modules (SLP's, Microcredentials etc). SAQA certificates must be provided for any international qualifications. 2. USAf approved cognate foundation programme	<p>Candidates who have completed an USAf approved cognate foundation programme from a registered and accredited provider may be admitted. The additional English and Maths criteria fall away.</p> <p>An USAf Exemption Certificate is required - the Office of the Registrar will facilitate, on behalf of the student, an application for degree admission to USAf, once the student has provided proof of payment to USAf.</p>
Transfer students	Candidates who have successfully completed at least 120 credits on the first year of a cognate degree may be admitted. However, if a student completed less than 120 credits, the admission criteria on the NSC or equivalent apply.
Outstanding Modules on Bachelor of Art in Law and Bachelor of Commerce in Law	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. One Outstanding Module: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.1 The student may be allowed dual registration where they must register for the outstanding module on the BA (Law) or BCom (Law) and also register on the LLB. 1.2 This dual registration is on the proviso that: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) A Law Programme Manager (PM) has counselled them and confirmed which LLB modules they have been approved to register for. The PM will also confirm which modules on the BA (Law) or the BCom (Law) they will be approved for credit onto the LLB. b) As far as possible students are to be approved for LLB modules which do not clash with the timetable and assessment schedule for the outstanding BA (Law) or BCom (Law) module, which takes priority. Should there be any clashes due to any changes that may occur, the student must take the responsibility to plan their academic programme accordingly. c) The maximum completion times rule in IIE010 apply, where applicable. 2. Two or Maximum 3 Outstanding Modules: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2.1. Where a student has 2 or maximum 3 modules outstanding, they need to repeat these modules, however they may, in consultation with the Law PM, be allowed to register for a limited number of LLB modules provided that the 180 maximum credit rule applies, as their priority should be to complete the BA (Law) or BCom (Law).

OQSF qualifications	Candidates with an OQSF Level 5 cognate qualification may be admitted, provided the OQSF qualification has at least 120 credits at NQF Level 5. An USAf Exemption Certificate is required - the Office of the Registrar will facilitate, on behalf of the student, an application for degree admission to USAf, once the student has provided proof of payment to USAf.
One Module Outstanding	<p>Candidates who have one module outstanding to complete an IIE Higher Certificate which is appropriate for admission to a degree, may register for the degree on the condition that they will register for the outstanding Higher Certificate module along with the first year of the degree.</p> <p>If a student does not pass the module, they will be allowed to register again* for this module and any modules failed in the first year of the degree; however, they will NOT be allowed to register for the second year of the Degree, or any subsequent year, until they have passed the Higher Certificate module.</p> <p>*Registration is also subject to the maximum completion times rule in IIE010.</p>
IEB International Secondary Certificate	<p>Candidates must have achieved Bachelor's Degree pass and meet the additional admission criteria (where applicable).</p> <p>The OoR will apply to USAf for Exemption based on Senate Discretion.</p>
